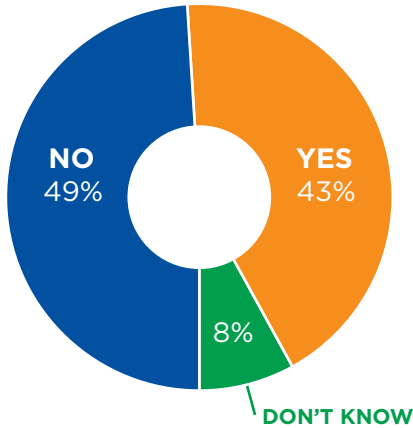


# INDEPENDENT POLLING REVEALS QLD ATTITUDES ON ABORTION

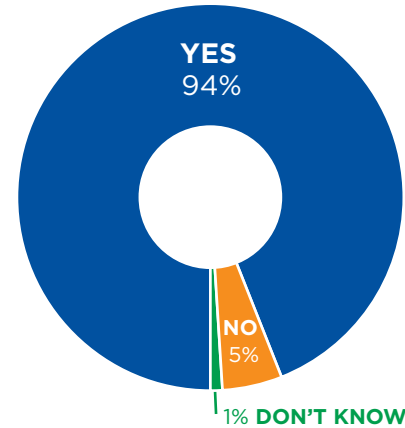
This 13 question randomised phone poll of QLD voters was conducted by Galaxy Research after the recent Rockhampton Court decision.

Q. Do you believe abortion should be decriminalised?



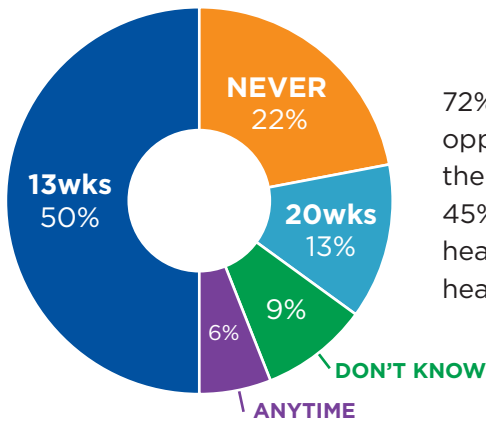
Contrary to claims by the pro-abortion lobby there is no consensus on abortion law reform.<sup>#</sup> In fact voters are split on this issue.

Q. Do you believe women should receive free independent counselling and information?



There is overwhelming support for more protection for women and conscientious objection rights for medical staff and doctors.

Q. Up to what stage would you allow abortion?



72% of Queenslanders oppose abortion past the first trimester, and 45% oppose abortion for healthy women carrying healthy babies.

Q. How would you vote at the next state election if your MP voted to decriminalise abortion?



At election time, the research indicates an average potential swing of 6% would be generated against members of Parliament who had voted in favour of decriminalising abortion (24% swing against versus 18% swing towards).
